## ELA

## Jennifer Rocco – 77 Cedarhurst Ave. WP

Ms. Rocco had the following questions concerning HIB.

- 1. Does an HIB decision transfer with your records to high school?
- 2. What percentage difference of HIB cases from this year to last year?
- 3. How many HIB cases have there been to date at Memorial and how does it compare to last year?

- 4. Is it legal for minors to be questioned without parental consent?
- 5. Is it legal for minors to sign statements of guilt without parent's present and without parental consent?
- 6. How often is the school required to educate students on examples of HIB during the school year?
- 7. What determines an HIB as opposed to a confrontation?
- 8. Is there any special accommodations legally required for students with IEP's regarding questioning without parental consent?

## Mr. Weiss responded to Ms. Rocco's questions:

HIB, harassment and intimidation of bullying is born out of the anti-bullying Bill of Rights and Act, which is a New Jersey law. When we think of harassment, intimidation and bullying, it's not quite what we would have thought of when we were in school. It's a very specific definition under the law and under the law, there's a couple different elements that would need to be present in order for something to be bullying. So, for example, there needs to be a distinguishing characteristic that the target has. You know, that could be body type or hair type or something like that. There has to be a substantial disruption in the students education and what constitutes a substantial disruption is very subjective, but that's another one of the elements that needs to kind of be satisfied in order for HIB to be an incident. As for disciplinary record, to the extent that there's discipline involved with the HIB, that would transfer to not just the high school, but if a student were to transfer to another public school in NJ. by law, the principal of the school from which the student is transferring is obligated within 30 days to provide the complete disciplinary file on the student to the new school. So in a way, to the extent there was discipline associated that appears in a disciplinary file, that file will be transferred to another New Jersey Public School and to the high school, but once it's at the high school it stops there. It's not something that appears on a college transcript or anything like. With regards to your questions about the percentage of HIB's and how many has Memorial had, all of that information is required to be reported by the school district to the State and not just to the state, but to the public. Twice a year the totals are reported and at every board meeting where there has been an incident, it is reported and voted on by the Board. The year to year data is all available on the DOE's website. If it's not on the DOE's website, it's probably on the district's website. I would suggest you ask Dr. Pillari for that information, she can provide it rather easily. When a situation doesn't have the required elements under HIB, so again, it's only two little pieces that I'm telling you, but there's more than the distinguishing characteristic and the substantial disruption, for example, another element is that a reasonable person should know what would have the effect of harming someone. So if those elements aren't necessarily met, but yet there's still some sort of conflict between the students, more likely than not, that incident would be handled through the district's code of conduct. So again, you may have a situation where someone is called a name but there's no substantial disruption so it's not HIB, but nevertheless we want to address it because it doesn't belong in school and we want to, try to help our students along. That would be handled under code of conduct. There could be a whole range of things that are done. When questioning the children, the anti bullving Bill of Rights Act does not say that parents must give consent or need to give consent, or should be asked for consent to meet with the student. So the district has the ability and right, because they stand in the shoes of the parent when the parents not here. The district has the right during any checking investigation to interview the child without parental consent. As far as the written statement goes, many times, depending on the cognitive abilities of the student or the ages of the student, students will be asked to write out a statement in their own handwriting as to what happened. Hypothetically, if a parent said you are not allowed to interview my child as part of an HIV investigation, under the circumstances, the district would say thank you for your input but we're interviewing the child because we have the right. As far as the IEP and questioning students, when a student is disciplined and if it's a special education student or student with an IEP, we're always going to look to see what that students cognitive level is if they have an understanding of what they did because we're not going to punish a student who can't understand the situation or the reason behind it. If we have a student who, for lack of a better term, doesn't know what they're saying, we may not be able to hold that student accountable, but at the same time we want to try and protect that student and have that be a teachable moment for that student, so that when he or she is older and out in the community, they have an understanding of others, be that empathy and other people's feelings and how their words and deeds can affect them. Mr. Weiss stated that many of these answers can be found on the DOE's website under frequently asked questions.
