Protests at Rifle Camp Park Have Paid Off

We all love Rifle Camp Park here in Passaic County and a few months ago, a group of people showed that they don't want it to change one bit. The Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders wanted to construct an 18-hole disc golf course at Rifle Camp Park. You're probably wondering what on earth disc golf is. Disc golf is a sport like golf where instead of hitting a ball with a club, you throw a disc, pick it up where it landed, and continue until you hit all the targets. The Board had a meeting in Pompton Plains in July and they had many arguments against the plan. Bruce James led the meeting and stressed that the disc golf course would attract people to the park and would not damage the forest. The project would cost \$20,000 and would require removing some trees and adding concrete. Many people are against this project and have protested with signs. I myself have seen the protests in front of Rifle Camp Park.

The Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders also wanted to add a dog park to Rifle Camp Park in an area that is home to migrating birds. People in Passaic County have put together protests against this plan and the disc golf course plan. A walkathon in Clifton, NJ promoting the "Plant a Billion Trees" move, held up a banner with the faces of some of the freeholders on it. The argument made by these protesters is for one thing— nature is important and the disc golf course will destroy the forest. Also, they say Rifle Camp Park is an Audubon Important Birding Area and cutting down the trees will destroy the habitats of birds and other animals. These animals include the redheaded woodpecker and the barred owl, as well as bats.

In October, the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders agreed to consider other locations for the construction of the disc golf course. They have proposed to construct the course at the Preakness Valley Golf Course in Wayne instead of Rifle Camp Park. County Freeholder Sandi Lazzara announced this, and has said that they will try to issue a report by the end of the year. Preakness Valley has a golf course, trees, a clubhouse, and more, so many people think it is suitable for building the new disc golf course. Protesters are relieved that their efforts were rewarded. The new disc golf course sounds quite interesting and we'll just have to wait to see what new location is proposed.

According to Science: The Universe Shouldn't Exist

Our existence is one big question. At one point, we all wonder how it all started and how we came to be. But according to scientists who have spent their careers trying to find out how the beginning of everything didn't destroy itself, the universe shouldn't exactly exist. The current model for the beginning of the universe predicts that equal parts of matter -- the substance of which all material is made -- and antimatter -- a material composed of antiparticles which have the same mass as particles of ordinary matter but have



opposite charge and properties were produced by the Big Bang. Since matter and antimatter are identical except for their opposite electrical charges, they overpower each other. When both of

them collide, they arouse in a violent eruption, meaning nothing should be here today, according to scientists. Researchers at the European Organization for Nuclear Research have tried to find differences in the particles' mass, electric charge, even properties that haven't been defined yet, but everything comes up identical. Their latest study made the most precise measurements ever — 350 times more precise than previous numbers — of matter and antimatter's magnetism. But those came up identical, too. "An asymmetry must exist here somewhere, but we simply do not understand where the difference is. What is the source of the symmetry break?" Christian Smorra, the study's lead author, said in a statement. Researchers are now looking at the gravity of antimatter, hopefully providing the clarification we need to understand how we can explain anything at all.

It has a 10-point multi-touch PixelSense Display and has up to 3240 x 2160 of pixel resolution. The laptop can support E Ink, Surface Pen, and also Surface Dial. 
3. Hello, Neighbor!

Have you ever heard of the word STEM: science, technology, engineering, mathematics? Do any of these subjects spark interest to you? Would you be willing to wake up early in the morning and get to school at 7:00 a.m.? If you answered yes, then, you should consider the S.T.E.M I: Explorations class at Passaic Valley High School your 8th grade year. The course covers four major topics: computer programming, computer-aided design (CAD), biomedical engineering, and environmental science. In computer programming, you will be exposed to using Arduinos, a device where you can make your own projects using electronic components and C++ code language. In computer-aided design (CAD), you can design and create components that will be used in various projects throughout the year with a 3D Printer. During biomedical engineering, you will create your own biomedical devices using CAD and learn how it's used to improve healthcare as well as building machines that have human-like motions. Lastly, for environmental science, you will learn about the world we live in and how to solve environmental problems. At the end of the year, you can create an actual weather-balloon to conduct experiments high above the ground. You will also meet and collaborate with other chosen 8th graders from Little Falls and Totowa.

Below is a Q&A session with current STEM students from Memorial School.

Q: Do you find taking this high school course challenging?

A: Yes, because I was newly introduced to STEM, which I was never familiar with, but now I'm getting used to it. *Chyna S.*

Q: Is it worth it to wake up early in the morning to take this class?

A: Waking up early isn't that much of a challenge, especially when you know that you're waking up early for an opportunity that not everyone has. It's also a great way to learn new STEM skills which are becoming increasingly popular. *Diya P*.

Q: Would you recommend this class to other students?

A: Yes because if they're interested in STEM, then, the course will be more enjoyable and you will get more out of it. There's no point in taking a class you don't like. *Jaidyn D*.

Q: What are the requirements in order to take this class?

He put on his shoe


Then it went BOOM

Then hit himself with a pan




