Fourth graders help Borough with annual Arbor Day tree plantings

The Borough marked Arbor Day with the planting of four trees on Dowling Parkway with the help of the Beatrice Gilmore Elementary School fourth grade class.

Mayor Keith Kazmark, Councilwoman Tracy Kallert and Councilman Joseph Spinelli were on hand to speak with the students about the importance of planting trees. Mayor Kazmark said he hoped the children would remember the day and in the future, see how the trees grow and maybe someday tell their children about the experience.

Children's librarian Allie Steiger from the Alfred Baumann Public Library also read some short poems to the students from a book that she noted the library would be donating to their school.

Grant funding allows Charles Olbon school garden to continue

Last year as part of the Young Audiences project, Charles Olbon School created a school garden, consisting of seven raised beds outside the gymnasium entrance. This year, the school was awarded a Bullock Garden Project Inc. Garden Grant, which will allow the garden to continue. The Bullock Garden Group is providing the plant seedlings, netting, twine, and garden tools, as well as educational lessons.

Last week, second grade classes weeded and turned over the soil to prepare for planting. The project is being overseen by Ms. McGinnis and Mrs. Monahan. While the students began working, they found some lettuce and carrots already growing from last year's seeds.

Master Gardeners from the NJ Agriculture Society will be helping with on-site support. The goal is to create an edible garden that students will interact with and learn about nutrition and eating fresh and healthy food.

"It's designed to be a farm to school program, where kids are really learning about growing their own food," said Principal Giovanna Irizarry. The garden will also be infused across the curriculum, in subject areas such as reading, writing, math, science, social studies and health.

WPPD plans summer Junior Police Academy for 11 to 14-year-olds

The Woodland Park Police Department is planning a Junior Police Academy this summer. The academy will be held July 16 to 20 at Memorial School, 15 Memorial Dr., from 8:30 a.m. sharp to 3:30 p.m. each day. Lunch will be provided as well as a cadet shirt, shorts, hat and water bottle. The program is designed for 11 to 14-year-old youth to develop a deeper understanding and appreciation of law enforcement.

The program is offered free of charge. All applicants must be a resident of Woodland Park. Only the first 30 completed applications will be accepted. Pick up applications at the dispatch desk in the Police Department inside the Municipal Building, 5 Brophy Lane. Once completed they can be dropped at the same location. The application includes a medical/physical waiver which must be signed by a doctor noting the cadet is in good physical condition to participate, as the academy will include daily physical activity (running, push-ups, calisthenics, etc.).

A mandatory orientation will be held on Thursday, July 12 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers at the Municipal Building. Both the cadet and a parent/guardian must be present. For further information, contact Det. Dan Dugan at 973-345- 8117 or ddugan@wpnj.us.
