




Crazy Hat Day

It was virtual spirit week for Beatrice Gilmore School students. Both students and staff members showed off their school colors, crazy hats, rain gear and more!


















Busy Bees


A reminder that the

Who Qualifies for Full Day Preschool?

Any child who is a resident of Woodland Park and who will be 3 or 4 years of age by October 1, 2020.

How many seats are available?

There are 52 - 3-year-old seats and 42 - 4-year-old seats available for September 2020 to be filled by a lottery drawing.

How do I get my child on the list?
