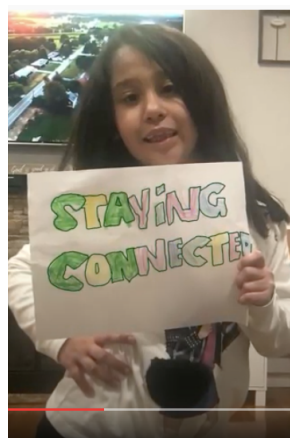
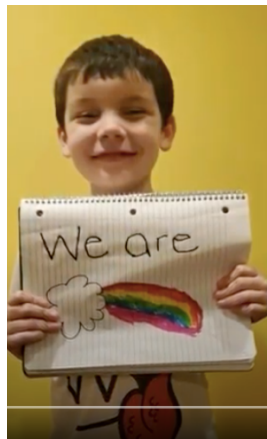
Town's Summer camp registration is still ongoing

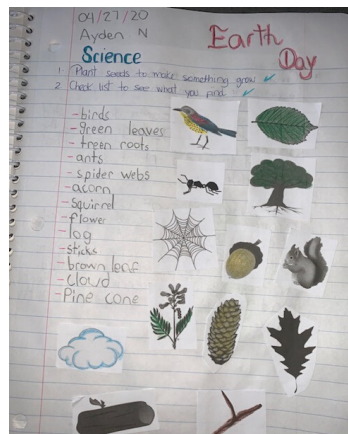

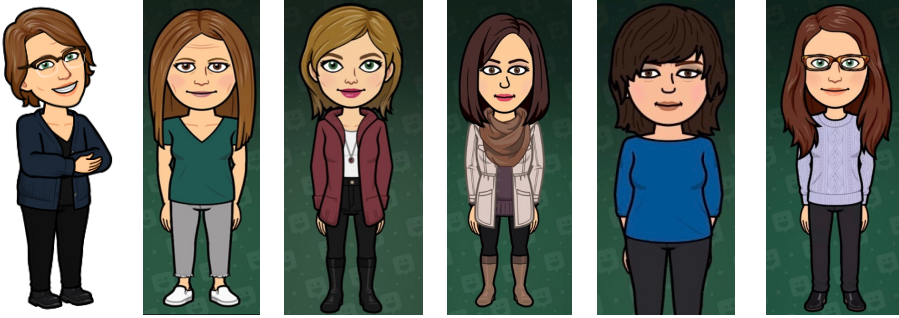
Charles Olbon's Mrs. Skrbic wanted to share the work of her second grade student Ayden, who did a fantastic job on his Earth Day assignment.

Ayla in Ms. Gilhooley's class at Charles Olbon built a birdhouse out of a recycled container for her Earth Day project.

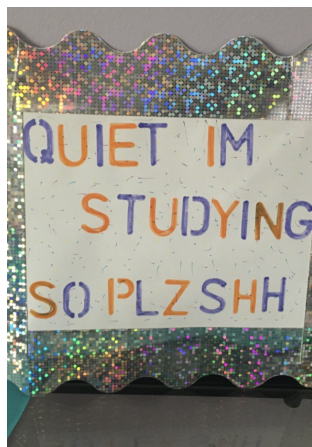
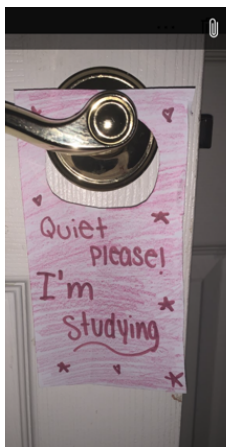
Tiny Teachers Tour The Town

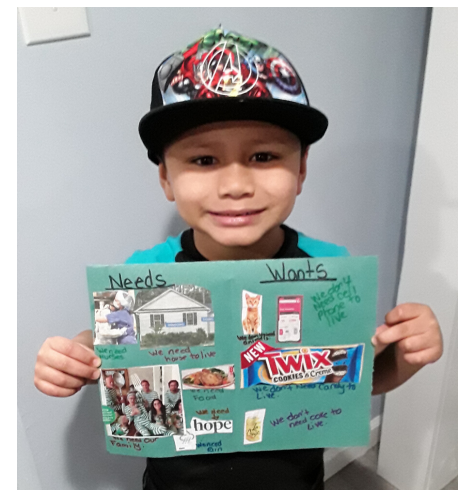


Keeping Motivated

School district provides updates on end of year activities

Mayor Keith Kazmark and Dr. Michele Pillari hosted a Town Hall virtual Facebook Live last Thursday night where they spoke about a number of topics.

- The School District is working to plan a graduation for Memorial School's 8th grade class of 2020. There currently are no specific plans, as they are not finalized. The District is awaiting specific guidance from the state as to what will or will not be permissible.
- Pre-K and kindergarten moving up ceremonies are not set in stone yet. Parents should await information from their teacher once plans are made.
- Last day of school is June 17.
- Memorial yearbooks will be out in June and directives for pick-up will be forthcoming. Charles Olbon and Beatrice Gilmore yearbooks are still in progress and will be finished in the summer and distributed the first week of school in September.
- Field trip payments that were made prior to the schools closing are in the process of being refunded.
- Kindergarten orientation will be rescheduled to some time in August.
- Directives on how personal items in the building can be picked up and items belonging to the district can be returned will be forthcoming.
- ESY (Extended School Year) will still take place, however it is uncertain at this time whether it will be virtual or in person.

Important message from the school nurses
