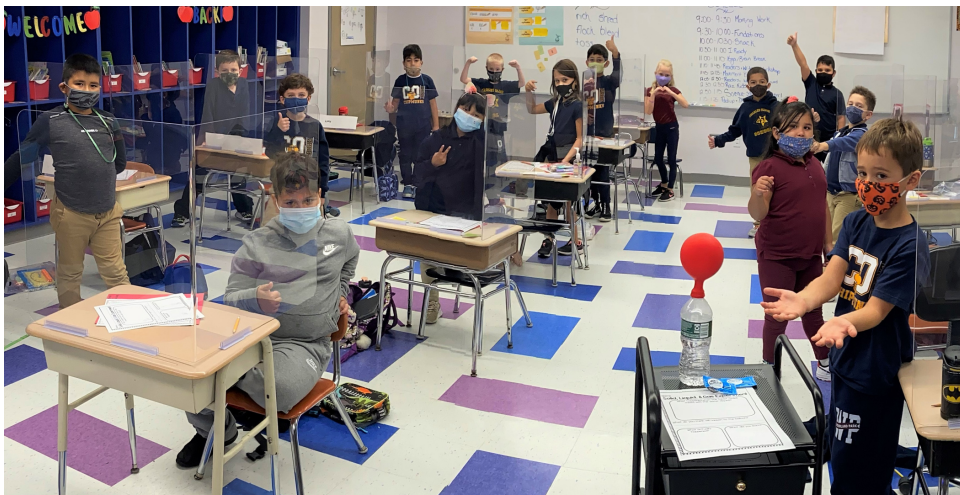

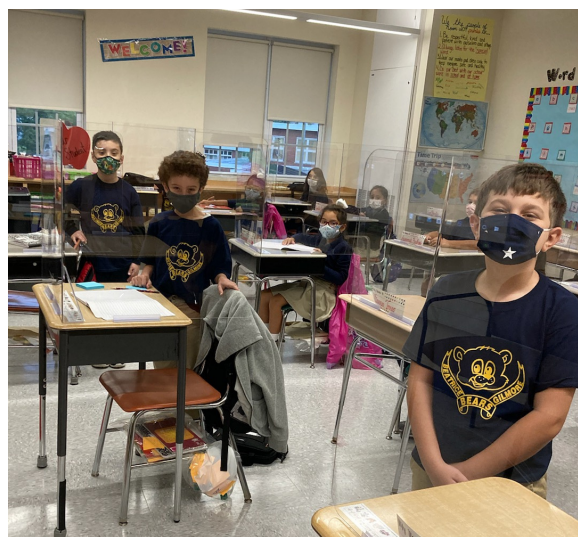
Finding What Matters

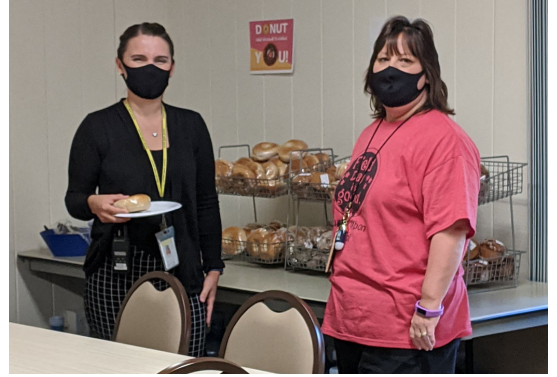

Fun Night Out



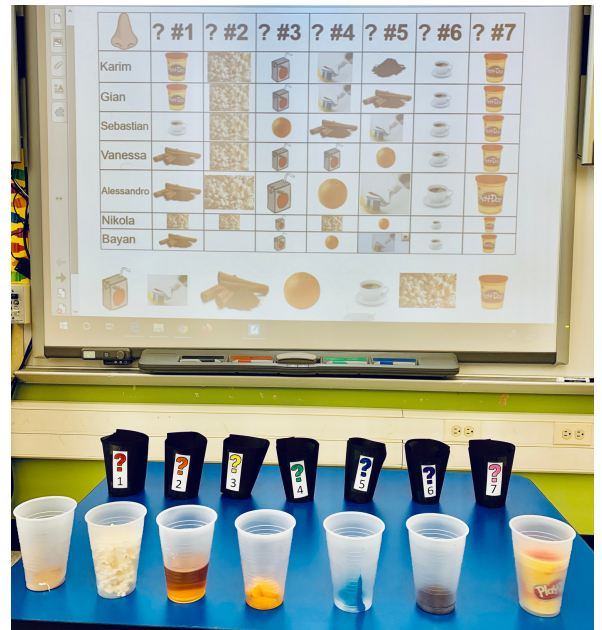

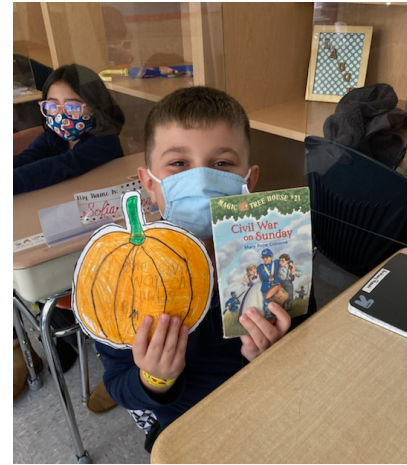
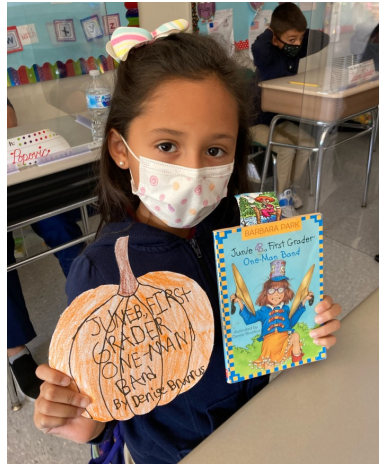
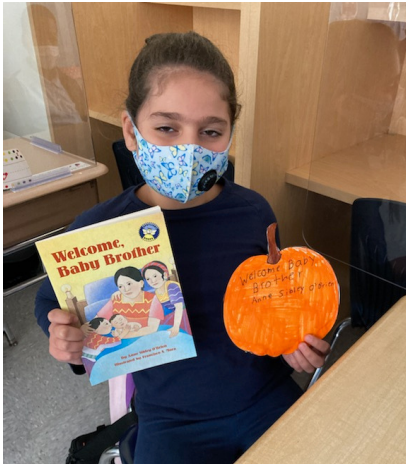
The Charles Olbon Home & School Association welcomed back the teachers to the new school year with a yummy breakfast during the second week of school.
