

Ms. Tonti's first grade class at Charles Olbon recently had a campfire day where they practiced the art of storytelling as well as reading stories to their classmates.





#### New STEM course at Memorial uses "flipped classroom" model

STEM is a new class in Memorial School this year. Students will be doing some science, technology, engineering, and math activities encompassed into one giant, end of marking period project, with teacher Miss Ament. There is a STEM website, created by Miss Ament, which will be a companion to the class, where students can access class notes, homework, and various other resources. The STEM classroom uses a flipped classroom model. Students will read about or watch a video lesson the night before class and complete a quiz that goes along with it.
