In an effort to protect the health, safety and welfare of students and staff, Woodland Park Schools switched to all remote learning on November 10th. All schools are closed for in-person learning. It is anticipated that our schools will return to in-person learning on December 11th.

During remote learning, students will participate in live Google meets everyday and instruction will continue as close to usual as possible. Students are expected to sign in to school on time each morning and for every class.

Please note the following schedule for these online classes:

Period 1 - 8:30am-9:10am

All students will attend the core subjects before lunch. This includes science, social studies, language arts, and math. After lunch, students are expected to sign back in to complete cycle classes. This includes music, spanish, gym, financial literacy, art, and STEM.

Small group instruction time is also scheduled in the afternoon. It is imperative that students attend small group instruction time as assigned. During this time, teachers meet with students for various reasons. Some students need additional support, some need enrichment and still others just participate in check in time for a question/answer session. It also provides time for the students who just need someone to talk to or just want to say. "Hi!". We are all in this together and need to support each other in order to have a fun and successful school year!

Woodland Park Hit Hard with COVID-19

As reported by our Mayor, Keith Kazmark, Woodland Park has been hit hard with numerous cases of COVID-19. He stated in his most current letter to the townspeople, "We realize that virus fatigue has set it. People are tired. We get it. But things are heading in the wrong direction. Passaic County has seen the most severe spread state-wide this past week, adding 32.8 cases per 10,000 residents - a 73% increase over the week prior. Unfortunately, Woodland Park had **75 NEW** cases in a week - the highest ever. Based upon the ages of those infected, we believe the spike came from Halloween. With the holiday season coming, this risk will only increase."

Please remember to stay vigilant and use these safety precautions as shared by the school nurses earlier this week:

1. Wash your hands often. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a

public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.

2. Avoid close contact. Inside your home: Avoid close contact with people who are sick. If possible, maintain 6 feet between the person who is sick and other household members.

3. Cover your mouth and nose with a mask when around others. Everyone should wear a mask in public settings and when around people who do not live in your household, especially when other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.

4. Cover coughs and sneezes. Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, clean your hands with a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. (continued on page 3 - **VIRUS UPDATE**)

5. Clean AND disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.

6. Monitor Your Health Daily. Be alert for symptoms. Watch for fever, cough, shortness of breath, or other symptoms of COVID-19.

7. Protect Your Health This Flu Season. It's likely that flu viruses and the virus that causes COVID-19 will both spread this fall and winter. Healthcare systems could be overwhelmed treating both patients with the flu and patients with COVID-19. This means getting a flu vaccine during 2020-2021 is more important than ever.

Grey's Anatomy is an extremely popular series that is highly rated by several film critics. This show is highly recommended


